

Among those present were representatives from Royal Life Saving Service of Australia, South Wagga Lions, 1RTB Kapooka and other camps (especially 5 RAR), Wagga Swimming Club, Scouts, Red Cross, many representatives from Royal Life Regional Area, Department of Sport and Recreation, Wagga City Council, State Government Schools, Calvary Hospital and Wagga Country Club.

Relatives and friends attended from Melbourne, Lakes Entrance, Batemans Bay, Queensland, Bathurst, Sydney, Newcastle, Wagga and surrounds.

Funeral arrangements were in the hands of Burgmann and Bance Funeral Home, 95 Fitzmaurice Street, Wagga.



I have been told that your request for information on 5 RAR items for sale is being handled by the committee in Sydney.









PLAQUE 7RAR MEMORIAL WALL 1 RTB WAGGA WAGGA




CAPTAIN BRIAN LE DAN 1966




SOLDIERS CHAPEL 1 RTB KAPOOKA

D COY ACTIVITIES IN STH VIETNAM 6 May 66 - 20 Apr 67

GENERAL

1. D Coy arrived in Sth Vietnam by air on the 2 and 7 May 66 and departed by HMAS Sydney on the 20 Apr 67. The Coy returned to Vung Tau on 30 Apr 67 when the main body embarked for Australia. The following is a record of the Company's operational activities during that period.

OPERATIONS

2. During the tour of duty the Company took part in 26 different operations. They were;

3. The Company spent 36 days on TAOR and/or ambush patrols.

AREA PROTECTION

4. During the period the Company spent several days protecting areas outside our own base.

6 RAR = 10 days Binh Bah = 5 days

BASE ACTIVITIES

- 5. Initially the Company spent 17 days at Vung Tau prior to being committed to operations. This time was spent on "in theatre training".
- 6. Between operations the Company spent a total of 93 days in the base area. On these days we put up our wire, built bunkers, buildings and sand-bagged our tents.

RECREATION!

7. During the tour the Company spent 8 days at Vung Tau.

8. We spent 353 days in Vietnam, broken up into the following brackets.

9. The Company arrived with a full strength of 5 Officers and 118 OR's. During the year we lost 29 men, made up by the following causes.

- 10. The Company accounted for the direct elimination of 36 VC, of which 25 were KIA.
- 11. My sincere thanks for a job well done. You can be extremely proud of your effort.
