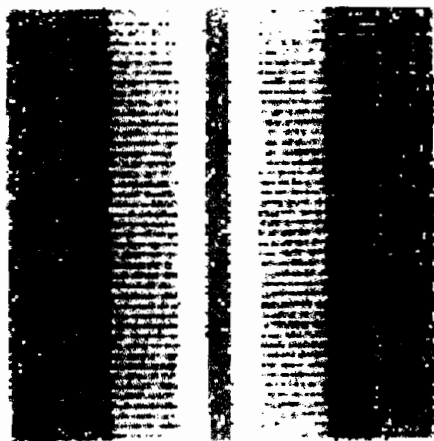

- Third Band—Light Blue
- Inner Band—Yellow
- Centre Band—Red

The plan is to issue a batch of medals by Anzac Day 98. This initial batch will be about 5,000. Who will get the first issue? According to The Minister's office, those who applied first. If you applied early (when no decision on the medal was made) you may need to apply again.

INTERESTING FACTS AND FIGURES

US casualties - **58,169 KIA 304,000 WIA**. The average age of US soldiers KIA23.11 years. 5 men KIA were 16 years of age, the oldest man killed was 62. Crippling wounds were 300% higher than in WW2. Small arms fire was the main cause of death in Vietnam - 52% compared to WW2 - 32% and Korea - 33%. The medevac system in Vietnam was fast and efficient which resulted in 2% of those evacuated dying of wounds in hospital. During the second world war, 4.5% of the wounded died in hospital. The term "Dustoff" was adopted from the radio callsign of Major Charles Kelly, a famed pilot killed in action in 1964

FRANK FITCH MM

The 5 RAR Association regrets to announce the passing of Frank Fitch MM. Frank was a well known and respected member of the association and will be deeply missed by us all. The 5 RAR Association offer our deepest sympathy to Frank's wife and family.

PRIVATE FRANK FITCH

Private Frank Fitch enlisted in the Australian Army on the 30th October 1967. He joined 5 RAR on the 3rd of March 1968 as a stretcher bearer in the Medical Platoon. On the 4th April 1969, during operation "Overlander" in Long Khanh province, D Coy came under heavy machine gun and rocket fire from enemy occupied bunkers at a distance of twenty metres. During a heavy firefight that lasted over one hour, two members of D Coy were killed and thirteen wounded. The leading scout, who was subsequently shown to have been killed by machine gun fire, was lying within ten metres of the enemy position. Private Fitch, discarding his own personal weapon and carrying only his medical stores went forward to assist the leading scout. He returned to the remainder of the platoon and moved fifty metres to the flank to assist another critically wounded soldier. At this time Private Fitch was himself wounded in the stomach by rocket fire. Throughout the remainder of the action, Private Fitch, although always under accurate enemy fire, continued to move around the platoon treating the other twelve wounded soldiers. Over two hours later, during the evacuation of the wounded, Private Fitch was still treating others and refusing any help himself. He displayed a complete disregard for his own safety and despite his own wounds placed the care of others as his only concern.

Frank was awarded the **MILITARY MEDAL** for his courage and devotion to his fellow soldiers on the battle field.

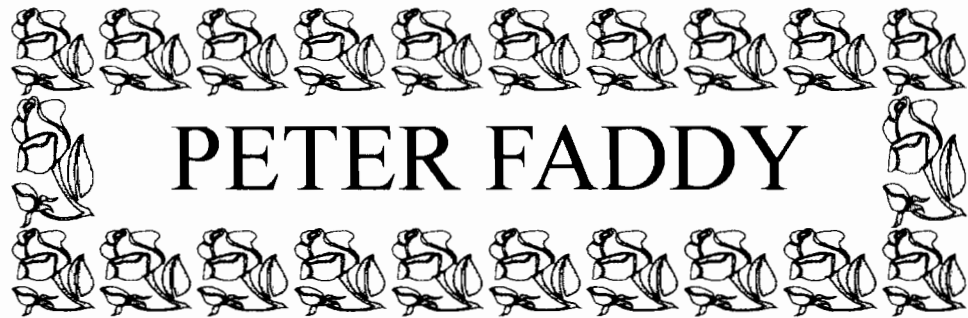

The 5 RAR Association regrets to announce the passing of Peter Faddy. Peter served with 5RAR during 1966/67 as a sergeant in Admin company. He also saw service in Korea and served with the First, Second and Third Battalions, making up three tours of duty in Korea. On retirement from the Army, Peter worked as a general assistant for the Education department. He became ill with a heart complaint and spent the last 12 months in hospital. Peter passed away on the 27 March 1998 aged 65 years. Peter leaves behind his wife Barbara, four children and five grandchildren. The funeral was attended by several members of the Association which included Col John Warr DSO, Blue Hush, Tassie Wass and others.

'LEST WE FORGET'

A GOOD NEWS STORY

OPERATION FLINDERS is being conducted in South Australia. No, it is not a military operation, although it is not far removed from one. Operation Flinders is an organisation set up by serving and ex-serving members of the military and police service. The Operation Flinders Foundation, as it is called, take young juvenile offenders into the Flinders Ranges for a seven day exercise as sections of 8/10 young people. Each section cover about 15 km a day to reach a base camp. They learn bush craft, rope climbing, aboriginal culture, river crossings and so on.

Colin Cogswell MM is a member of this organisation. Colin served with 5 RAR in 66/67 and was awarded the Military Medal. During the mine incident (B Coy) Colin was Badly wounded and was evacuated to Australia in 1967. Colin took his discharge after serving six years in the Army. 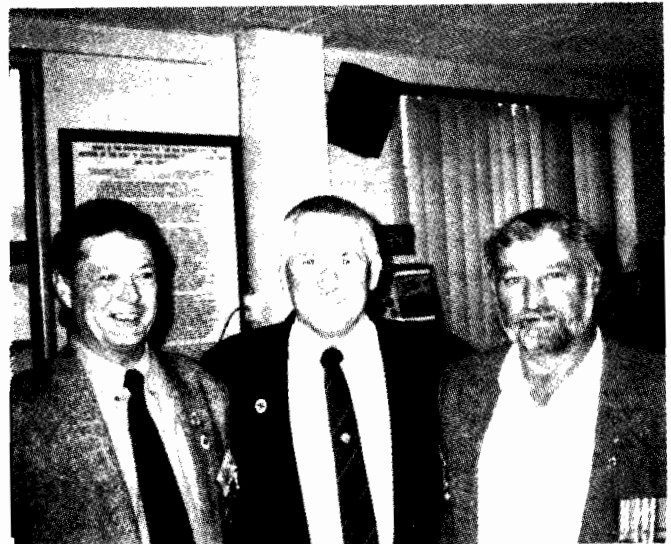
MARCH OUT KAPOOKA

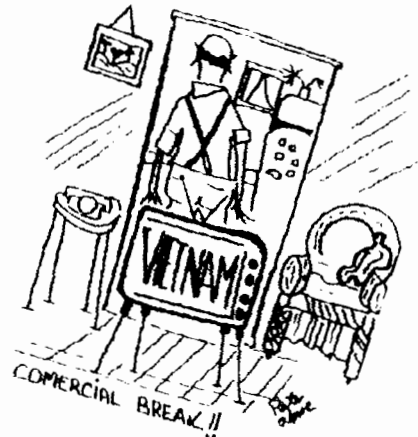

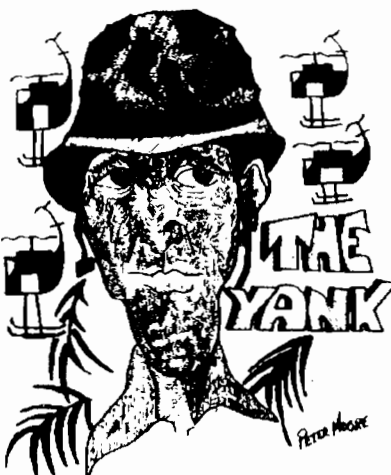

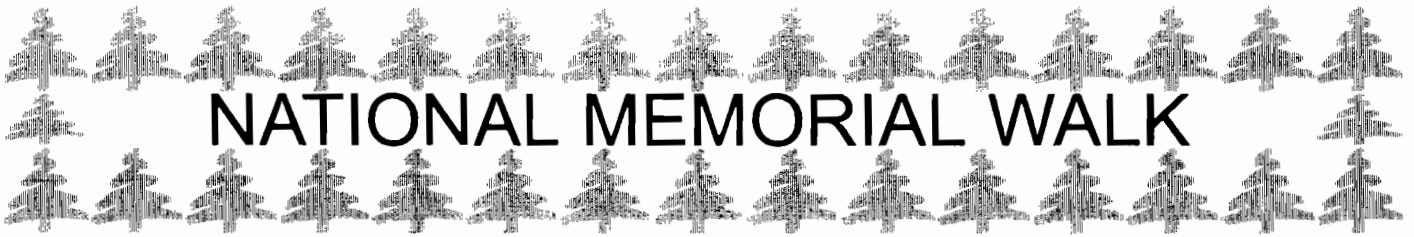

MORE ON THE AASM (Australian Active Service Medal)

Awarded for warlike services between 1945-1975

In general, the AASM will be awarded to members of the Australian Defence Force who served in the respective qualifying areas and periods;

KOREA. Served in Korea and qualified Korea Medal for service between 1 July 1950-27 July 1953.

MALAYA. Qualified for General Service Medal between 16 June 1960-11 Aug 1966.

MALAYSIA. Borneo, Sabah, Sarawak and Brunei between 17 August 1964-11 August 1966 (Including Singapore)

VIETNAM . Qualified for general Service Medal, Vietnam Medal or the Logistic and Support Medal between 24 December 1962-27 January 1973.

ORDER OF PRECEDENCE

The Australian Active Service Medal is worn after any Second World War Awards and before any other campaign awards.

As mentioned previously, there is some confusion if all applications have been successful. The way that I solved the problem was to ring CARO in Melbourne to see if my name was recorded. It was, and there is no need in my case, to apply again. The first 5,000 medals have been issued. The next issue will occur when new stocks are received. Application forms are available from the RSL and also in a previous issue of Tiger Tales. Editor.

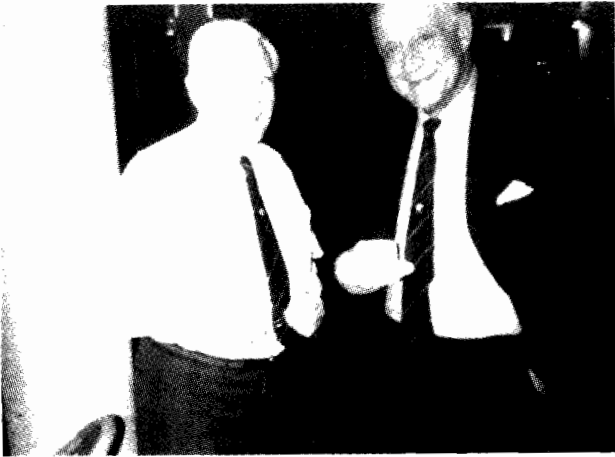
